


InTREEgued?

1. DONATE AND PLANT NEW TREES THROUGHOUT THE EUGENE AREA IN PARTNERSHIP WITH FRIENDS OF TREES.
2. SHARE SOME OF THE WOOD WITH THE PRIOR TENANTS, THE TRAUMA HEALING PROJECT, FOR CEREMONIAL USE.
3. REUSE WOOD FROM THE LARGEST TREES IN VARIOUS PROJECTS SUCH AS MAKING TABLES, BENCHES, OR WALL ART.
4. PLANT 6 NEW SPECIES OF STREET TREES ON THIS LOT (SEE THEM BELOW!)

Why the change?

- The prior street trees along 11th were spaced much tighter than typical and were all too small (and unhealthy) cherries.
- The replacement street trees are at the usual (approximate) spacing and are Urban Forestry-approved canopy trees.
- A large Red Sequoia, which is not an approved street tree due to structural damage from their root systems (and thus listed as an on-site tree here), needed to be removed from the lawn for construction.
